Community Commitment for Groundwater Join Us to Explore Solutions

Watsonville, CA – With brown lawns and dying vegetation evident everywhere in California, can we still look to agriculture to provide locally grown food sustainably? This and other questions will be addressed by members of the Community Water Dialogue at the launch of the "Community Commitment for Groundwater" next Tuesday, July 28, from 4:00 to 7:00 pm at Pajaro Dunes Sandpiper Center (2661 Beach Rd).

The Community Water Dialogue (CWD) is a stakeholder sponsored group committed to finding local, community supported solutions to the long-term overdraft in the Pajaro Valley. Those solutions include on-farm conservation measures, managed aquifer recharge, novel technologies to increase irrigation efficiencies for all agricultural users in the Valley, and supporting the Basin Management Plan capital projects and programs developed by the Pajaro Valley Water Management Agency (PV Water). Together with PV Water the CWD has raised awareness of the urgency of seawater intrusion and decreasing groundwater levels. With these new technologies and the increased awareness to protect the groundwater that we rely on, there appear to be significant improvements in irrigation efficiencies. More details on historic water use and updates on work being done by local growers, UCSC, the RCD and others will be presented at this event.

News media are invited to join us next Tuesday to learn about the current state of the groundwater basin, the new sustainable groundwater management legislation in the state and the hard work being done by the agricultural community and committed stakeholders to protect the aquifer that supports the vibrant agricultural community here in the Pajaro Valley. Hear directly from growers and landowners who are making a commitment and taking action to conserve water on their operations.
